

## INFORMATION BULLETIN COVID-19 MARCH 27, 2020

The Town of Claresholm continues to follow all guidelines and protocols put forward by Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health and urges residents to do the same. By following public health guidelines, we are all promoting the health of our community.

All playgrounds in Claresholm are closed. This includes the skate park at the Claresholm Arena. Open spaces are not closed but strong social distancing is required. As spring is upon us, the weather should be improving. Get out and enjoy the fresh air, but do not congregate in groups. Maintain at least 2 metres (6 feet) between yourself and non-family members.

As of March 28, 2020, Centennial Park campground will close until further notice. To further promote the health and safety of the public, and to align with Alberta Parks and Parks Canada, the Town finds this to be a necessary step.

Above all, be kind to each other. Reach out to family members and friends by phone or electronically. Wave to others from across the street. Limit errands to essential items only as little as possible. The more we adhere to public health guidelines, the sooner we can get through this.
